Dear friends,

The Ollmann family needs your help. On Thursday, August 2<sup>nd</sup>, our youngest son Garrett was approached by a stranger pretending to be a police officer. We need your help to find him so that the real police can investigate his behavior and take appropriate action.

Kenny, my father, Grant and Garrett returned home around 3 pm after running errands all day. Being cooped up in the car for a while, Garrett wanted to play outside. He put on his helmet, got on his bike and road up the street to his friend's house to give him his belated birthday present and to see if he could play. Unfortunately, his friend wasn't home so he got back on his bike and coasted down the driveway. His foot slipped off the pedal so he paused for a second at the end of the driveway to readjust. That is when a car pulled up behind him. The driver, who was alone in the car, got out of his vehicle and walked towards Garrett. He told Garrett to get into his car, that he was a police officer and that he was going to take him to his (the driver's) house.

Thank God for the faculty and staff of Cactus Ranch Elementary for teaching my children Stranger Danger. It works! Being such a friendly, talkative little guy, we always worried that Garrett would be the one to carry on a conversation with a stranger. Fortunately, Garrett noticed that the man "did not have any of his equipment", got scared and road home on his bike as fast as he could pedal. Garrett looked back to make sure that he wasn't being chased and saw the man pull into his friend's driveway, back out turning around to drive the opposite way.

We are so blessed that our precious son is safe and that he was able to give a very detailed description of the man and his car to the Round Rock Police Department.

The car was a four door sedan with faded blue paint. The driver's door was white as if it had been replaced and the back bumper was damaged as if it had been hit from behind. Later we learned that it could have been an old police or detective car; possibly a Crown Victoria.

The driver was a male, possibly 20-ish years old. He had dark brown hair with bangs just above his eyebrows, short around his ears and just below his shoulders in the back. He had a goatee and was lightly tan, possibly a very light Hispanic. (Garrett described him as darker than his mom but lighter than his friend, who is African American). He was wearing black pants, and a dark blue / navy T-shirt.

He was spotted the next day by our next door neighbors. He was traveling Eastbound on 1431 as they were traveling Westbound at the intersection of Parmer Lane. Our neighbors tried to turn around so that they could get his license plate number but the traffic was too heavy. They tried to call 911 to let them know that there was a Williamson County Sherriff traveling directly behind him but couldn't get the Round Rock Police Department to connect to Cedar Park to connect to Williamson County fast enough and he got away once again.

Therefore, WE NEED YOUR HELP! Please be extra mindful as you drive to work or while running errands. If you see someone driving a vehicle matching the description of the car, PLEASE write down the LICENSE plate number and call 911 immediately. Then please call or email Kenny and I so that we can get forward the information to the detective immediately. With your help, we will find him and keep ALL of our children safe.
